# Catch Culver

#### City Council Meeting of July 17, 2023

**Council Workshop** – 6:00 p.m. Workshop presented by Caprielle Lewis from Business Oregon. She explained the programs available and how they help communities. She provided a handout and answered questions from the council.

Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, & Roll Call: Mayor Bart Carpenter called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and Councilor Woods led the invocation. Mayor Carpenter and Councilors Tim Woods, Dave Beck, Chuck Rushing, Scott Ough, and Josh Thody were present. The Agenda and Consent Agenda were both approved. Informational Items: Citizen's Input: Cindy Dix addressed the council and asked them to reconsider the Code Enforcement directive to the officer for the program to be complaint driven. Old Business: Appoint Park Committee Member: No applications were received and the council tabled the appointment. Ordinance 2023-06 updating the City's Flood Hazard Ordinance Requirements was approved. New Business: Resolution 2023-11 Approving an amendment to farm lease with Macy Farms LLC was approved. Middleton, Ough and Thody were appointed to a committee to research and make recommendation regarding an Entry Sign. Beck, Woods and Carpenter were appointed to a committee to research and make recommendation regarding the <u>Culver Employee Handbook</u>. Reports: <u>Linda Victorine</u> reported the Urban Renewal District has an opening on the board due Barb Frazier resigning her position and a vacancy has been declared. Patti Carpenter reported: 1) The Chamber meeting is the following day. 2) The 4th of July Parade went well. 3) There are many activities going on this summer. <u>Jack Ickler</u> reported the reservoir is currently at 39% so there is still a serious shortage of water. Brent Schulke reported he has processed 20 cases so far with 9 closed, 2 were unfounded, 2 are unwilling to comply, 6 are working towards compliance, and there was 1 an animal compliance issue. Kim Symons reported: 1) She has been repairing the damages from the storm and met with the engineers to look at what part of the storm system is working and where are failures and problems. 2) The city needs to provide education on the appropriate uses for the drainage ditches. 3) They appreciate the local Girl Scout troop for helping put out flags on the 4th of July. 4) They have been busy working to control weeds and keep the city looking good. <u>Donna McCormack</u> reported: 1) A Stormwater Master Plan meeting was held and the best alternative may include obtaining the rights to use nearby privately owned property. Alternatives are being considered and the council discussed contacting the owner to share the information. 2) The city received everything necessary for Shorty's Taphouse to proceed. 3) The Community Center survey should be ready by the Culver Crawdad Festival which will provide people and opportunity to discuss the project and respond to the survey. 4) Councilors Woods, Beck, Ough and Mayor Carpenter and Donna McCormack are currently signed up for the LOC Conference on Oct 12-14th and the council was reminded if they cancel, fail to participate, or fail to notify staff in time to avoid charges to the city, the individuals are personally liable for whatever it costs the city. <u>Jered Reid</u> reported: 1) Some of the nuisance violations can now be processed through the court system. 2) He also toured the city reviewing the stormwater system and feels it is important to review our ordinances to ensure they are appropriate to protect the stormwater system. Council Reports: Woods, Beck, Thody and Ough had no report. Rushing reported he would like to commend the Park Committee for all their work on the Crawdad Festival and everything seems to be coming together very well with everyone doing a great job. He also indicated Denise Woods deserves a very special Thank You for all her work on the project. Mayor Carpenter reported: 1) He met with the group working on the Community Pathway and provided a letter of support for the grant. 2) He will set a meeting with the fire department to discuss how to move forward with district consolidation. 3) He will discuss the Sheriff's Office reports with them.

**Adjournment:** The Mayor adjourned the meeting at 7:35 p.m.
