

### November 2023 City Council Meeting

**Workshop:** Ray Soliz, Jefferson County Assessor to present information on property taxes and explain how they are impacted by various legislative changes. The public is invited to attend. The Council meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Meeting Mintues

The meeting was called to order with Luke Middleton, Tim Woods, Bart Carpenter, Chuck Rushing, Josh Thody, and Scott Ough present. Tim Woods led the invocation, and the council approved the agenda and consent agenda with Josh Thody declaring a conflict of interst. **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:** Gabby Beebe with the Jefferson County Library District presented information on the drop box that is now installed at city hall but awaiting training before it will be operational, expected within a month. Kim Schmith with the Jefferson County Kiwanis Operation Rudolph program and requested donations. The city agreed to be a drop point for donations and to include it in the newsletter. Citizen's Input Bill Atherton addressed the council explaining his proposed changes to the land use laws. He is preparing legislation and requesting support. Cindy Dix reported that Keith Manufacturing donated \$1,000 to the skate park project and she requested financial assistance from the city as well. OLD BUSINESS: The council approved the 2<sup>nd</sup> Presentation of Ord 2023-07 Park Regulations Ordinance. Denise Woods was selected as the Volunteer of the Year. The Capital Improvements List was presented and discussed. Donna McCormack provided an update on the Park Expansion Project and explained the city is accepting comments on the revised plan. A town hall meeting is scheduled for Dec. 6th and then after the changes are incorporated, the plan will be sent to the engineers for a cost estimate. The city will then determine if changes need to be made or if the plan is adequately funded. The council adopted the Safe Routes to Schools Plan. **NEW BUSINESS:** The Council approved the 1st Presentation of Ordinance 2023-08 (Container Ordinance). Kim Symons presented the problems she is experiencing with the Buildings HVAC System. The council awarded the Holiday Bonuses. STAFF REPORTS: Committee Reports: Jered Reid reported Jack Jones was appointed to the Urban Renewal District and he summarized the projects they are working on. Patti Carpenter reported the Chamber of Commerce is reviewing the survey results and looking at what they qualifications they would like in a new director. Nuisance Abatement Officer, Brent Schulke reported he has had three new cases and he explained that one case has gone to court while another is still in process. Administration, Donna McCormack explained the auditor still has not responded and the council authorized staff to obtain a different auditor. She also reported that she received an estimate for an appraisal. Attorney Jered Reid explained that he will reach out to EDCO regarding the Earth2o building. COUNCIL & MAYOR REPORTS: City Council Reports: Tim Woods reported he attended a meeting with the fire department and they discussed the possibility of annexing into the fire district. The next step will be to create a cost/benefit analysis. Chuck Rushing reported there will be a tree lighting ceremony and parade on Dec. 1st and there is a vacancy on the committee due to Nancy Diaz resigning. Josh Thody reported he is working with the URD on a sign. Luke Middleton and Scott Ough had no report and Mayor Carpenter reported the next meeting will be the Holiday Dinner. The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
