SKATE PARK/PARK EXPANSION PROJECT UPDATE

The City entered into a funding agreement with the Darlene Urbach Memorial Foundation recently. This agreement clarifies the roles of both parties. In essence, it changed the responsibility of the project from Urbach's to the City. The City is waiting on a cost estimate of the entire project from our engineering team. The delay in receiving the cost estimate seems to be based on the other elements of the park. However, the estimates will likely be substantially higher than the funds available to the City from the grant and Urbach foundation. As such, the City needs to know how the funding will be obtained prior to committing to the entire project. Please be assured the process is moving as quickly as possible the city is very excited and as anxious to complete the project as the community.

Culver City Council Meeting
January 23, 2023

Workshop: The Council will review the existing Strategic Plan and receive an update on the state of the Strategies identified in the plan.

CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE & ROLL CALL: Mayor Bart Carpenter called the meeting to order; Pastor Allen Riley led the invocation: Councilors Luke Middleton, Tim Woods, David Beck, Chuck Rushing, Josh Thody, & Scott Ough were also present. **THE AGENDA AND THE CONSENT AGENDA** were approved as well as the Budget Calendar. The Budget Committee Meeting will be held on April 3rd at 6:30 p.m.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS: Jered Reid presented the Urban Renewal District Annual Report for FY ending June 30, 2023 and explained there have been no expenditures since 2022 and with a full slate of members, they are considering projects. Donna McCormack explained the fire district has passed an ordinance 23-01 assessing cost-based fees and rates for development applications and applicants will now be required to pay a fee for code review. Following discussion, the council directed staff to have the applicants submit their applications directly to the Fire Department for comments. **Citizen's Input:** Debbie Taylor has been hired as the Chamber of Commerce Director and she requested the council to provide direction on what updates they would like from her. They will receive monthly reports from Patti Carpenter will be sure to ask if they have any questions. **OLD BUSINESS:**

Cindy Dix was appointed to the Park Committee. Ordinance 2023-08 was presented for the second reading and the council tabled a decision so they could gather more information. **NEW BUSINESS:** Luke Middleton will remain the Council President and Dave Beck is the Vice-President. The liaison positions will remain the same. Resolution 24-01 authorizing an ODOT grant for street repairs was approved. Resolution 24-02 Approving an Amendment to the Professional Services Contract with Mecca Investigations was approved and Resolution 24-03 approving a Donation and Construction Agreement with Darlene Urbach Memorial Youth Fund Regarding Culver Skate Park Project was also approved.

STAFF REPORTS: Patti Carpenter (Chamber of Commerce) reported the board is having two meetings a month. Brent Schulke reported he has processed a total of 30 complaints in the last year with 1 still in process, 1 went to court, 1 is still unresolved with massive amounts of debris and junk. There were also 13 vehicles, 5 weed/tree violations, 2 animal complaints, 3 trespassing complaints and 4 miscellaneous complaints have been resolved. Kim Symons was thanked for all of the work she did during the recent storm event and she thanked all of the people who helped out. She reported: 1) The fire department door was damaged and the sink froze when the furnace went out. 2) She reviewed the need for purchasing equipment and summarized the equipment being considered and the council discussed various options. 3) she passed her sewer collection systems test and is studying for the treatment test. Donna McCormack asked if any of the council wanted to attend the LOC spring conference (no one did) and received authorization to request proposals for an auditor for the 23-24 fiscal year audit. **COUNCIL & MAYOR REPORTS:** Woods reported they met with the fire department and are discussing a cost/benefit analysis that COIC will complete. Discussions include building ownership and improvements, as well as services to be provided. Rushing reported the committee is beginning work on the Crawdad Festival and everything seems to be going well. Ough asked public works about the wastewater connection for Shorty's Taphouse and suggested there may be URD funds available. Another URD project could be to install sidewalks in the city. Thody indicated he would like to finish some of the projects before starting more and expressed concern about the time it is taking to complete the park expansion project. Middleton and Beck had no report. Mayor Carpenter reported he has just completed his first year as Mayor and thanked everyone for their input, comments, and discussions.

ADJOURNMENT: the meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
